Story

On Friday, November 18, 2016, I stood on a rusty nail which pierced the skin. I have no tetanus protection as I am allergic to anti-tetanus serum. Went to ER and received an IM injection of Gamma Globulin in (right) buttock. Monday 21st Nov., went back to ER due to severe pain in my right knee with some puffiness behind the knee. Doctor in ER did not palpate the area or have it x-rayed. Told me to apply ice and take anti-inflammatories. Diagnosed it as sciatica. I was limping at this time. This led to my paying \$600.00 for a private MRI of my knee which demonstrated a torn meniscus and a delay in getting an orthopaedic appointment.

Best and Worst Aspects of the Experience

The negative aspect of this care experience was the lack of professional assessment of my health complaint.

I had surgical repair of right torn meniscus in July of 2017.

I would like to see that all healthcare providers take time to listen/assess and treat appropriately, the health concerns that the public bring to them.
